23 February

Just in case we thought that the birding was over, we were passing the large shopping centre close to the airport Phil called out “Swifts.”

As these birds were on Seaun’s wish list he quickly pulled off the carriageway and into the shopping centre where we soon found the birds in question.

They were easily identified as Plain Swifts.

Which considering that the last two birds added to the list were Eastern Yellow Wagtail and Plain Swift they brought the very successful trip to an appropriate conclusion.

Whilst I have not noted every single bird in the text above, I will make an inclusive list below.

I will not include the Latin names just the common English Names.

The number recorded was a mere 49, which is less than that recorded on many of the group outing the lack of numbers is more than compensated by the sheer quality of those that we did record.


